Regular Meeting**

Chairman Irwin called the September 8, 2020, regular meeting of the La Paz County Board of Supervisors to order at 10:02 a.m. Elected Officials and Department Heads present were: Chairman Holly Irwin, Vice-Chairman D. L. Wilson, Supervisor Duce Minor, County Administrator Ron Drake, Chief Deputy County Attorney Ryan Dooley, Finance Director Terry Krukemyer, Elections Director Kevin Scholl, Human Resources Director Mary Frantz, Assessor Anna Camacho, Community Development Director Tonya Hoogerwerf and Clerk of the Board Diane Green.

Chairman Irwin led the Pledge of Allegiance followed by the Invocation given by Pastor Glenn Swarthout of the First Baptist Church.

Dorothy Fenech, Employee of the Month Chairperson, presented Diane Jones-Zakrajsek, Quartzsite Justice Court Chief Court Clerk, with the August 2020 Sandy Dodge Employee Excellence Award along with a \$25 Walmart gift card.

Community Development Director Hoogerwerf presented Docket No. Z2020-005, APN: 305-12-006G for a public hearing on the vacant property owned by Vi Quoc Lam.

She described the surrounding zones of properties, adding that it was located in Floodzone X; sixteen (16) property owners were notified of the request for rezoning, with only one objection located outside the 300-foot area of notification, with no other public comments.

She stated that there were no responses from the Review Committee.

Chairman Irwin opened the public hearing and asked if anyone wished to comment on the request for rezoning.

There being no comments, Chairman Irwin closed the public hearing.

Chairman Irwin asked the Board if they wished to comment.

Supervisor Minor stated that he was in favor of the development; however, he asked if residents that had questions from the Planning & Zoning Commission meeting had their questions answered; and expressed that he did not know if the Arizona Public Service (APS) was in favor of the project.

Community Development Director Hoogerwerf confirmed that the objector at that Planning & Zoning Commission meeting came to the department's office and received information from staff.

Discussion ensued with the inclusion of Jim Daniels, agent for the property owner; and Orian Bashkiroff, Project Manager for development, on the processes the project would be subject to, particularly with regard to APS; and the location of the project was noted at North of a church and stopped short of Highway 60.

Vice-Chairman Wilson asked about the anticipated capacity and use of water.

Further discussion noted the anticipated capacity to be 17 megawatts on approximately 60 acres with water access allocated and ruled by the closest water district, or trucked in for the construction portion of the project; and a substation located South of the church in that area would be used to assist in transmission of the produced power.

Supervisor Minor noted that the Planning & Zoning Commission approved the Docket.
