

**MINUTES
OF THE
LA PAZ COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
Thursday, September 4, 2014, 10:00 a.m.
Special Meeting**

Chairman Wilson called the September 4, 2014, special meeting of the La Paz County Board of Supervisors to order at 10:00 a.m. Elected Officials and Department Heads present were: Chairman Wilson, Supervisor Irwin, County Administrator/Clerk of the Board Field, Elections Director Quinn; and Deputy Clerk of the Board Green.

Approve the canvass of the 2014 Primary Election held on August 26, 2014 – Elections

Chairman Wilson stated that Supervisor Clapperton was not present for the meeting as he was addressing an important issue in Bouse.

Elections Director Quinn presented the canvass of the 2014 Primary Election held on August 26, 2014. She stated that out of 8,943 registered voters, 2,342 ballots were cast for 26.19% participation.

She stated the Board's packet contained the list of candidates and write-ins; the audit report of early voting; the audit tracking the number of paper ballots to and from the polling locations; a summary of total votes for the entire County, followed by a summary of totals by precinct.

She stated that, for the record, she wanted to thank the many people that put in many hours of time and effort to assist herself and her assistant, Nick Grenwalt, at the polls, the early boards, the counting center; as well as the post election counting of early, provision, and conditional ballots.

She stated that she had "120 new best friends".

CHAIRMAN WILSON MOVED to approve the canvass of the 2014 Primary Election held on August 26, 2014. Motion seconded by Supervisor Irwin, passed unanimously.
