

**MINUTES
OF THE
LA PAZ COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
Monday, February 22, 2022, 10:00 a.m.
Regular Meeting**

Chairman Minor called the February 22, 2022, 10:00 a.m., Regular Meeting of the La Paz County Board of Supervisors to order at 10:00 a.m. Elected Officials and Department Heads present were: Chairman Duce Minor, Vice-Chairman Holly Irwin (via Zoom), Supervisor David Plunkett (via Zoom), County Administrator Megan Spielman, Chief Deputy County Attorney Ryan Dooley, Clerk of the Board Diane Green, IT Tech Joey Lucas, Health Director Marion Shontz, Assessor Anna Camacho and Superior Court Clerk Holly Lucas.

Chairman Minor led the Pledge of Allegiance followed by the Invocation given by Pastor Julian Barbara of Calvary Christian Fellowship.

Presentation: Sandy Dodge Employee Excellence Award for January 2022

Employee of the Month Chairman Yvette Enchandt-Mott presented Christina Turk, County Attorney Legal Assistant, with the Sandy Dodge Employee Excellence Award for January 2022 along with a gift card from Walmart.

Call to the Public: This is the time for the public to comment for a limit of three (3) minutes per person. Members of the Board may not discuss items that are not specifically identified on the agenda. Therefore, pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.01(H), action taken as a result of public comment will be limited to directing staff to study the matter, responding to any criticism or scheduling the matter for further consideration and decision at a later date

Judi May expressed that she felt that the county was not one county but split into three because there are three supervisors with their own district and did not act for the benefit of all. She felt that the Board over the years had not handled its money well, noting the Yakimna judgement tax and salary increases on the agenda. She felt the County was trying to run the taxpayers' lives, and she was unsatisfied with the Supervisor's years of over-site.

Chairman Minor clarified that the Yakima one-cent tax was no longer effective since the judgement had been paid off.

Donna McCoy announced that she wished to introduce herself and stated that she was running for the legislative district office to be vacated by Regina Cobb. She stated that her concern was for rural Arizona, and her plans were to work together with Representative

Biasiucci. She encouraged anyone to call her at 928-208-1091 if they had questions.

Tyson Ross, Chief Probation Officer, explained, in view of previous comments, that his department is funded 75% by the State, and when he comes to a meeting to request salary changes, they are funds provided by the State and not general fund monies.

Chief Deputy County Attorney Dooley addressed the salary increase of the County Attorney's office, explaining that a senior prosecutor had left; therefore, instead of filling that high salaried position, they used it to promote from within. He added that the funds that would be saved from the consolidation of the Courts will be realized next budget year.

County Administrator and/or County Supervisor's Current Event Summary: The County Administrator or Board Member may present a brief summary of current events summarizing recent occurrences without any discussion or feedback from the remainder of the board. The Board will not propose, discuss, deliberate or take legal action on any matter mentioned in the summary unless the specific matter is already properly noticed for legal action, and then only at such time as that matter comes before the board itself pursuant to its meeting agenda. Chairman Minor announced that today was the one-year anniversary of Megan Spielman as the County Administrator. He noted that she proved to provide good leadership and professionalism with the tenacity the County needed.

County Administrator Spielman addressed the comments made regarding the County's finances and a few items on the agenda that were also addressed. She stated a lot of scrutiny happens when salary changes are requested and gave the departments praise for handling these situations, noting that the departments have held positions back in order to save money. She assured the public the County takes its financial situation very seriously.

County Administrator Spielman noted that School Superintendent Waggoner notified her that children from La Paz County schools would be advancing to the State Spelling Bee competition.

County Administrator Spielman gave a brief update on the court consolidation, stating that she met with the courts' judges and with the Santa Cruz Judge to see how they handled their consolidation. She stated that Judge Quickle would be issuing an order for record cleanup and to law enforcement. She stated that the clerks were being reached out to, addressing the human element, for the updating of resumes, classes to attend, and meeting with town leadership to assure they are not lost or forgotten.

Chairman Minor stated that the Take-A-Kid Fishing program was starting, expressing appreciation to Parks Staff and other volunteers who put that event together.
